rainy season is over before we put them back down on the basement floor!

We have also had a lot of help from two of the fathers of KCS students—Taz Oliver and Jason Langidrik. They have worked very hard helping build the woodshed in our back yard and chopping wood for our next winter supply of firewood for our fireplace! We are so thankful for everyone's servant-hearted help!



SUMMER PLANS: Making a decision to travel to the States was difficult for us this year. Every third summer we usually spend almost three months traveling and reporting to our supporting congregations, but this year there is COVID! (We have had one inoculation and the second will be June 18th.) We finally decided to travel to the U.S. in early July. Rickie's need to have corrective laser eye surgery in Missouri was determinative in our decision. That kind of surgery doesn't seem to be readily available in Japan. We are also looking forward to celebrating our 60th wedding anniversary on July 9th by staying in a Mongolian ger (yurt) where we honeymooned near Lassen National Park in 1961.
